He saw him who is invisible

It seems very contradictory to say that a person saw another who is invisible. However, in a Christian's life it actually becomes necessary to see the One who is invisible to live a life of faith. The Christian can walk through the path that is filled with unexpected twists and turns and hard problems only by seeing the invisible One.

The writer of Hebrews says Moses did not fear the wrath of the Egyptian king and endured in his journey because he saw the invisible God. Moses knew his call and was willing and ready to make himself available to help his people. I suppose his mother fed him not only her breastmilk and other foods, but also the plan of God about him at every time she fed him. Even when he was in the palace of Pharaoh and his mind was always with his people. When an opportunity came he applied his knowledge and strength to reveal to his people that he is their savior. We know that he failed miserably trusting in his own strength and devices. But at the proper time when he was commissioned by God he totally surrendered and confessed his weakness and inability. When he had no choice but to obey God's commission to lead the people out of Egypt from the clutches of the powerful king he knew he has to focus his eyes on the invisible God who is calling him. Everything he did since then was looking at the invisible God and he believed in the deepest part of his heart that he is actually seeing God.

Abraham obeyed God's call, left his country, waited for the Promised Land and the promised son, and was willing to sacrifice the promised son because he saw the One who is invisible.

David knew very well who he was and he has only limited skills and strength to face a giant. His focus, though, at that time was not on himself. He knew the God whom he served. He did not see the army of Israel as not the army of Saul but that of Almighty God. When Goliath insulted Saul and the army he saw that as an insult to the Lord of the Hosts and his eyes suddenly fell on the invisible One.

Elijah courageously faced the wicked king Ahab and rebuked him not because he had any power. His head could have been cut off at the very moment the scathing words came out of Elijah's mouth. But before he presented himself before the powerful king he had spent years behind the scene communing with the King of Kings and as he saw the invisible One he was strengthened to face the wrath of Ahab.

Along the path of life we come across defining moments and places where we have to make uncomfortable (and may be hard) decisions. There are times when our reasoning, understand-

ing, intelligence, and even the little faith will fail. Life's decisions, whether spiritual or otherwise, are not easy for a Christian. We are not called for an easy life. But we are not without help and guidance. We have a perfect GPS to guide us on our way, the perfect Prophet to reveal our next step and show the plans for the future, the great Shepherd to provide for and shelter us on every turn of the way. We just need to see the invisible One. The invisible God of Abraham, Moses, David, Elijah and thousands of other giants of faith is our God also. One day history will say you and I did what we did because we saw the invisible God if we train our eyes to focus on the invisible One.
